

It's an Early Childhood Development centre in the informal settlement of Overcome Heights / Vrygrond in Cape Town. 100 children from 1 – 6 years by taking them off the streets and providing them with two warm meals per day and early childhood education. It also empowers women to find employment in the area.



















The Hout Bay House Project in Cape Town

The collaboration between professionals from Europe and South Africa has led to the creation of the Hout Bay House Project in Cape Town. This endeavour brings together skilled builders, innovative material manufacturers, and emerging scientists. The primary objective of this research initiative is to devise tailored solutions for wooden constructions in Africa through international cooperation. Rigorous testing is conducted to assess the physical and technical characteristics of the buildings, aiming to identify the most suitable options for the South African market. Special sensors integrated into the structures gather crucial data on thermal properties, including the overall heat transfer coefficient, surface temperature, and humidity. These measurements are taken continuously during operation, allowing for ongoing analysis and trend evaluation.

News from the Wood Student Foundation Cape Town

George Kuratle and Elke Zwicker present the projects implemented by the Wood Student Foundation in 2023. At this point they would like to express their sincere thanks to all those who generously supported them and contributed to the realization of the following three projects.



1. The Bright Student Learning Centre

We have been supporting the two schools in Wynberg and Bellville for five years now. They were founded with the aim of providing young people, especially from Zimbabwe but also from other African nations, with a school education leading to a Cambridge English degree in Cape Town. With such a diploma, the world opens up to the students and they can apply for jobs in many places. In recent years, thanks to the financial support of the Wood Student Foundation, students from poorer family backgrounds have also been able to attend classes.

Every year, half of the required school fees are paid for 30 students. This contribution means a great relief for the parents, as the Bright Student Learning Centre is a private organization that does not receive any support from the state. Parents must therefore have to pay for their children's entire school fees.

This year, the Wood Student Foundation received another request to pay the examination fees for eight students for the Cambridge degree.

The fees per subject are extremely high and therefore prevent some students from accessing to the exams.

We must also mention an unfortunate incident. At the beginning of June, the school in Wynberg was attacked by unknown perpetrators and the entire daily school fees were stolen. Most foreigners do not have a bank account in South Africa, which requires them to pay their school fees in cash at the beginning of the quarter. The police believe this to have been an inside tip. This is a loss and setback for the school.





Shortly before the end of the year, director Sam therefore approached the Wood Student Foundation once again requesting support with the bonus payments for the for the 33 members of staff at the two schools.



2. Nourish Educare in Vrygrond

Four years ago, principal Pretty approached the Wood Student Foundation with a request to help her with her salary payments. Since then, she has regularly reported on the number of children and monthly expenses. Pretty has concluded her own further training over the last four years, encouraged her teachers to complete Level 4 training and improved her kindergarten to such an extent that she was able to apply for state accreditation. She proudly and happily received the long-awaited certificate. She immediately completed the necessary paperwork and has now received the promise of state financial support at the end of 2023. We would like to congratulate Pretty and her staff on this achievement. We always assumed that Pretty would be able to receive state support after recognition and thus become independent of the Wood Student Foundation. She has now achieved this feat.

Nourish Educare is now independent and will no longer require any further financial support as of 2024. True-North has the patronage of 29 such small kindergartens and is working towards all of them eventually becoming less independent. They have already enquired whether we would accompany another kindergarten to independence.

3. Nadine Solomons – Student

For four years, the Wood Student Foundation has been paying the college fees for Nadine Solomons, an exceptionally hard-working and talented law student. She graduated at the end of 2023, has already completed a three-month internship and will start her new job as a qualified lawyer in a law firm in 2024.

We are looking back with gratitude on the past year, in which we were once again able to provide financial support for our three projects and thus ensure continuity.

- The Bright Student Learning Centre can continue to count on help from the Wood Student Foundation.
- We intend to accompany another kindergarten from True-North through to state registration, which can take up to four years.
- At Little Lambs, the new aftercare centre is ready. We would like to increase our involvement here and, for example, take on the furnishing of the five classrooms and the office, as well as possibly the expenses for the urgently needed alarm system.
- We are also keeping our eye on the project "Mother & Child Home" project, which was presented at the last Wood Conference by the two architects Helen and Hard from Stavanger, Norway, and a team of architects from Cape Town. Unfortunately, important permits from the local authorities are still missing, which is preventing the release of the property in Hout Bay.
